

Common Tree Trimming & Pruning Mistakes

Trimming and pruning are critical aspects of tree care and maintenance. However, if done incorrectly, they can harm overall tree health and, in some cases, create a tree hazard. Using a professional **tree care services** firm with a certified arborist is always preferable.

Common Tree Trimming Errors

Trimming Any Branch: You look at the tree and pick out the branches that appear sparse and dead, deciding that those are the ones to cut. Trimming and pruning, on the other hand, have a science to them. When deciding which limb or branch to trim, you should be aware of the following:

- Branch location
- The exact amount to be removed
- How to Trim: Angle of Cut, Branch Type
- Which Tools to Use and How to Cut

By targeting the wrong branch or trimming at the wrong time, you can unintentionally harm the tree's health. A professional tree care company can assess the tree and determine the best course of action. Cutting the wrong limb or branch in the wrong place can harm the tree's ability to produce food and upset its balance. An incorrect cut can also harm the tree, making it susceptible to infection or disease.

Over-trimming: Ideally, 5–10% of total foliage-producing limbs should be cut. If you or an inexperienced worker goes beyond that, the tree's ability to grow, heal, absorb sunlight, and produce food will be severely harmed. It can also result in limb or branch death, which not only looks bad but can also pose a deadly and costly risk. A dead branch is a hazard because it has the potential to fall and damage whatever is in its path, whether it is a vehicle, a structure, or a person.

Topping a tree: Tree topping is a damaging technique used by inexperienced tree service companies. It's a method that indiscriminately removes branches from the crown, leaving the tree with eye sores and stubby branches. Branch decay occurs when branches are cut without regard to the health of the tree or nearby lateral systems. The tree may perish as a result of the damage. Tree topping and crown reduction are not synonymous. Instead of removing any major branches, crown reduction entails removing major branches that are dying, dead, or diseased.

This is typically only considered when there has been severe storm damage, the tree is sick and dying, or the branches are close to power lines.
