Learn About Do's

1: Go Through Customer Testimonials

Along with reading customer evaluations on-site, look for customer feedback on Google, Yelp or on websites. Based on recent consumer experiences, this will help you set reasonable expectations for outdoor plants. Previous clients might be a gold mine of knowledge.

Reading customer reviews on external websites will frequently also reveal what a customer liked or didn't like about the transaction/shipping process. On-site reviews, which frequently have ratings from one to five stars, will give you an idea of how satisfied customers are with a particular plant.

2: Do take your growing zone into account

Different types of outdoor plants online require different temperatures. So if you want to find specimens for your garden or landscape that will endure and flourish for years, research about the plant growing temperature. You'll make better decisions when choosing plants online.

3: Learn about the aesthetics of an ornamental plant in your garden or landscape

Learn About Don'ts

1: Don't Expect the Same Plant as Shown in the Image

The website's picture of the plant is not the actual plant you will receive; rather, it is a representation of how the plant will eventually look. For instance, the colour of the flower can differ a bit in reality. You can also get young cuttings, bare root plants, or potted plants if you order plants online. Don't ignore the seller's policies as you have a better idea of the plant you will receive.

2: Don't forget to plant a certain variety at the right time of year

If you're ordering outside plants, be aware that the majority of online vendors won't send them until the local climate is suitable for planting. Mostly the best time to plant trees is in the fall, so they may not ship until then.

3: Don't forget the plant's needs for growth

Even though it's simple to be seduced by lovely pictures of blooms and foliage, make sure the plant flourishes in your particular soil. Are you trying to find a perennial plant that will grow year after year? Or are you hoping for some seasonal colour? Before deciding whether a plant online is a good fit for your surroundings, learn what kind of water, soil, and light requirements the plant needs.
