



AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT'S GUIDE TO CODING BOOTCAMPS IN THE USA



Coding bootcamps are intensive, short-term programs that teach students the skills they need to become software developers. They are popular options for international students looking to break into the tech industry in the United States. Also, the **student loan crisis in the United States** refers to high student loan debt and default rates among borrowers.

As of 2021, the total outstanding student loan debt in the US exceeded \$1.7 trillion, and the delinquency and default rates on these loans have been rising.





Requirements for international students

When choosing a coding bootcamp in the USA, international students should consider the following:

Visa requirements: International students will need to have a student visa to attend a coding bootcamp in the USA. Make sure to check the visa requirements and the application process for the bootcamp you're interested in.

Location: Some bootcamps are located in major tech hubs like San Francisco and New York City, while others are located in smaller cities.



Curriculum: Choosing a coding bootcamp in the USA offers a variety of curriculum options, such as full-stack web development, data science, and mobile development.

Job placement assistance: Some bootcamps offer job placement assistance to graduates, while others do not. Make sure to check whether the bootcamp you're interested in offers this service.

Cost: Coding bootcamps can be expensive, so make sure to consider the cost and whether financial assistance is available.

How to move OPT to H1B?

Now How to move from OPT to H1B, so the process of moving from Optional Practical Training (OPT) to H1B status involves several steps. Here's a general overview of the process:

Find an employer willing to sponsor you for an H1B visa: This employer will need to file a Labor Condition Application (LCA) with the Department of Labor and then file a petition for an H1B visa with the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS).



Once the LCA and H1B petition is approved: The employer will need to provide you with a copy of the approved LCA and the H1B petition receipt.

With the approved LCA and H1B petition receipt: You will need to apply for an H1B visa at a U.S. consulate or embassy in your home country.

After you receive your H1B visa: You can enter the United States with H1B status.
