Measure your space and multiply the length

SURVEY AND PREPARE THE SITE

with the width to calculate the square footage that should be covered. Mark the area and ensure the panel doesn't obstruct switchboards or access points. **INSTALL THE FIRST PANEL**

Attach your first panel starting from the top

SECURE THE PANEL

Pull on the panel to make sure it's secure and
