Wisdom teeth, or third molars, usually emerge between the ages of 17 and 25. While some people have enough space in their mouth for these teeth to grow in properly, many do not. This often leads to impaction, where the teeth remain stuck under the gum or grow at an angle.

When this happens, it can cause a range of issues, including:

- **Pain and swelling** – As the teeth try to push through, they can put pressure on the surrounding gums and jaw.
- **Gum infections** – Partially erupted wisdom teeth can trap food and bacteria, increasing the risk of infection.
- **Pressure on nearby teeth** – Impacted wisdom teeth can shift other teeth out of alignment, leading to bite problems.
- **Cyst formation** – In some cases, fluid-filled cysts can develop around impacted wisdom teeth, which may damage the jawbone.

Because of these risks, dentists often recommend early removal before serious complications develop.

What Determines the Cost of Wisdom Teeth Removal?

The price of wisdom teeth removal depends on a few key factors:
